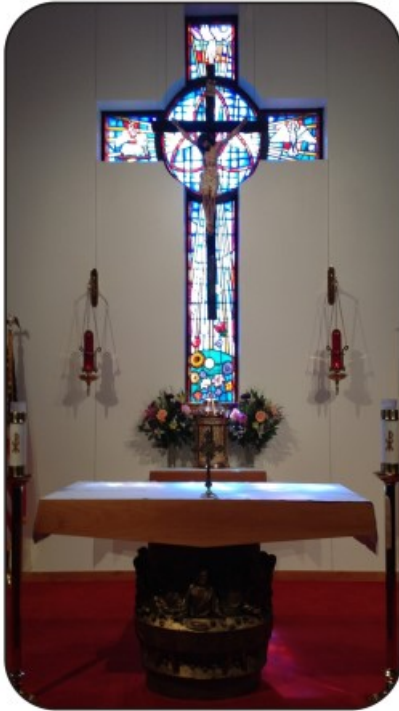

### **A Year of the Eucharist in the Diocese of Tyler**

**The real presence of Christ in the tabernacle.** In the Holy Eucharist, Jesus does not change through the words of the priest the accidents of bread and wine (their color, taste, shape, quantity), but only their substance, the very being of bread and wine, which ceases to be bread and wine and is changed in an admirable and supernatural way into the Body and Blood of Christ. **The appearances of bread remain, but there is no longer bread there; the appearances of wine remain, but there is no longer wine there.** God, who can create and who can annihilate, can also transform one thing into another; in the Blessed Eucharist He wanted to effect this miraculous transformation of bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ and for the change to be perceived only by means of faith. ### **PARISH AND DIOCESAN NEWS**

For those who plan to attend the Sunday liturgy: if you usually attend Mass on Saturday, we ask that you continue to do so. For Sunday Mass attendees, please come to the 9 am if your last name begins with A-I; come to the 11 am if your last name begins with J-Z. Daily Holy Mass is Tuesday thru Friday at 8 am in the Main Church. Thank you.**
- **Please remember that the Church is open daily from 8 am to 6 pm for private, individual prayer. Please continue to practice social distancing and other health protocol during this pandemic.**
- **The church office is now open! Regular office hours are Tuesday and Wednesday, 8:45 am to 3:30 pm. Proper social distancing protocol and other safety practices will be enforced.**

# CENSUS 101: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The 2020 Census is closer than you think!  
Here's a quick refresher of what it is and why it's essential that everyone is counted.

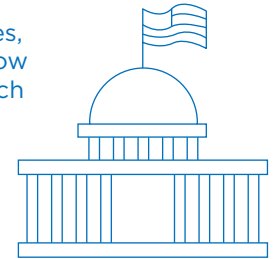
## Everyone counts.

The census counts every person living in the U.S. once, only once, and in the right place.



## It's about fair representation.

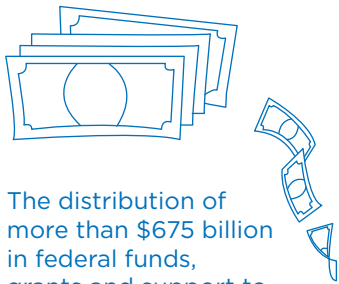
Every 10 years, the results of the census are used to reapportion the House of Representatives, determining how many seats each state gets.



## It's in the constitution.

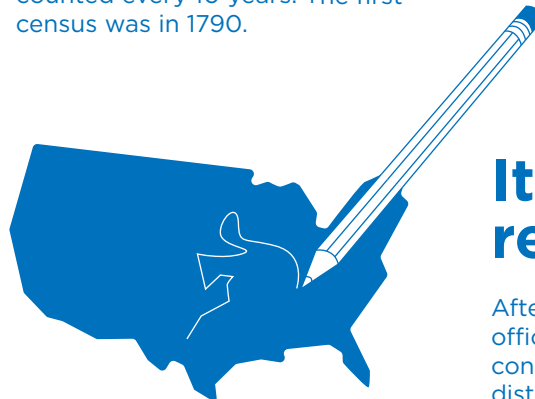
The U.S. Constitution mandates that everyone in the country be counted every 10 years. The first census was in 1790.

## It's about \$675 billion.



The distribution of more than \$675 billion in federal funds, grants and support to states, counties and communities are based on census data.

That money is spent on schools, hospitals, roads, public works and other vital programs.

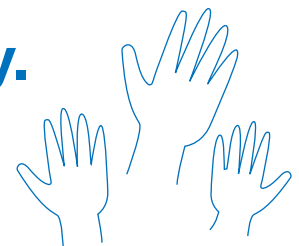


## It's about redistricting.

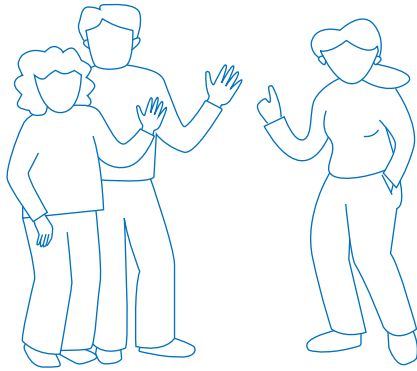
After each decade's census, state officials redraw the boundaries of the congressional and state legislative districts in their states to account for population shifts.

## Taking part is your civic duty.

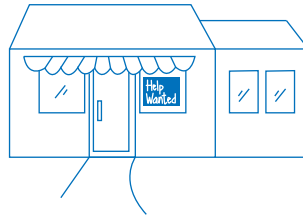
Completing the census is mandatory: it's a way to participate in our democracy and say "I COUNT!"



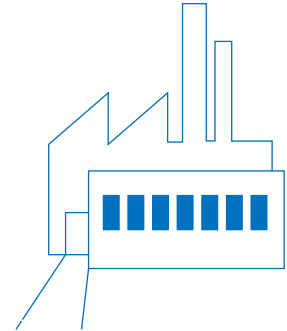

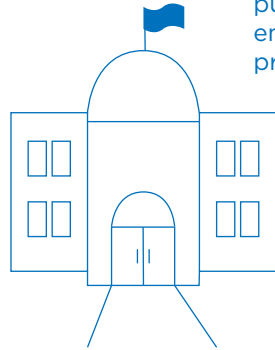
Residents use the census to support community initiatives involving legislation, quality-of-life and consumer advocacy.

Local governments use the census for public safety and emergency preparedness.



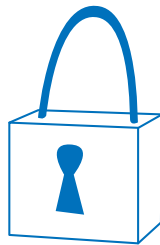
Real estate developers use the census to build new homes and revitalize old neighborhoods.



# Your privacy is protected.

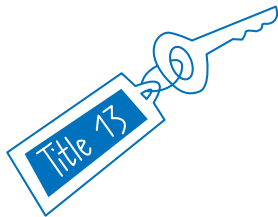
It's against the law for the Census Bureau to publicly release your responses in any way that could identify you or your household.
