• Easter Isn't a Day. It's a Season! The word "Easter" comes from Old English, meaning simply the "East." The sun which rises in the East, bringing light, warmth, and hope, is a symbol for the Christian of the rising Christ, who is the true Light of the world. The Paschal Candle used during the Easter Vigil is a central symbol of this divine light, which is Christ. It is kept near the ambo throughout Easter Time and lit for all liturgical celebrations.

For Catholics, Easter isn't just a single day of celebration — it's an entire season where we celebrate our new life in Christ. Just like Christmas, Easter is celebrated for an extended period of time— 50 days to be exact.

The feast proper is celebrated for the full octave (Easter Sunday through Easter Saturday).

Then we enter Eastertide, the longer Easter season which ends on Pentecost Sunday. During this 50 days of Easter we relive the joyous events of the Glorious Mysteries of the Holy Rosary: the Resurrection, Ascension, and the coming of the Holy Spirit on Mary and the Apostles at Pentecost.

Here are three ways you can make Eastertide a very special time of year for you and your family:

- 1. Read the Easter passages of the Bible. 2. Spread Easter cheer. 3. Increase your devotion.
- The Liturgy Committee will meet Wednesday, April 12, beginning at 10am.
- The Food Pantry will open this Thursday, April 13, from 8:30-10:30 am for anyone needing help with groceries. It is drive through only.
- The monthly East Texas Food Bank work day is scheduled for this Friday, April 14, beginning at 9am.
- There will be a **pot luck meal** next Sunday, April 16, after the 9am Mass. Bring a dish to share and come enjoy time with your fellow parishioners!
- Mosaic Counseling: Sometimes we just need to talk with someone. A grant from Christus Mother Frances provides free access to licensed counselors to talk about what you need to address: bereavement, marriage issues, depression, and so much more. There is no cost and this is not a gimmick or a scam. You can schedule to meet with a counselor in the Tyler office, via Zoom, or here. Your visits are strictly confidential and cost you nothing. - St. Raphael Ministry: Do you need a ride to a medical appointment or have someone come by for a visit? 



Catholic Prayer: Book of Blessings:

Blessing of Food for the First Meal of Easter

Easter SUNDAY • HE IS RISEN.

1701 The custom of blessing food for

Easter arose from the discipline of fasting throughout Lent and the special Easter fast during the Easter Triduum. Easter was the first day when meat, eggs, and other foods could again be eaten. Although not of obligation, the special fast during the Triduum may still be observed as well as the tradition of blessing food for the first meal of Easter.

1702 According to custom, food may be blessed before or after the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday (see endnote 8) or on Easter morning for consumption at the first meal of Easter, when fasting is ended and the Church is filled with joy.

1703 The blessing may take place in the church or another suitable place.

After the Easter Vigil Christ is risen. Alleluia.

And all reply: He is risen indeed. Alleluia.

1721 One of those present or the minister reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example: Brothers and sisters, listen to the words of the book of Deuteronomy:

16:1-8 The passover of the Lord. Observe the month of Abib by keeping the Passover of the LORD, your God, since it was in the month of Abib that he brought you by night out of Egypt. You shall offer the Passover sacrifice from your flock or your herd to the LORD, your God, in the place which he. chooses as the dwelling place of his name. You shall not eat leavened bread with it. For seven days you shall eat with it only unleavened bread, the bread of affliction, that you may remember as long as you live the day of your departure from the land of Egypt; for in frightened haste you left the land of Egypt. Nothing

leavened may be found in all your territory for seven days, and none of the meat which you sacrificed on the evening of the first day shall be kept overnight for the next day.

You may not sacrifice the Passover in any of the communities which the LORD, your God, gives you; only at the place which he chooses as the dwelling place of his name, and in the evening at sunset, on the anniversary of your departure from Egypt, shall you sacrifice the Passover. You shall cook and eat it at the place the LORD, your God, chooses; then in the morning you may return to your tents. For six days you shall eat unleavened bread, and on the seventh there shall be a solemn meeting in honor of the LORD, your God; on that day you shall not do any sort of work.

1722 Or: **Isaiah 55:1-11**--Come all you who are thirsty. **Luke 24:13-**35--They knew Christ in the breaking of the bread.

THE BLESSING

1723 A minister who is a priest or deacon says the prayer of blessing with hands outstretched; a lay minister says the prayer with hands joined.

God of glory, the eyes of all turn to you as we celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death.

Bless us and this food of our first Easter meal. May we who gather at the Lord's table
