- This weekend we take up the Collection for the Church in Latin America. Many people in Latin America and the Caribbean do not have access to Church programs and ministries because of a rising secular culture, difficult rural terrain, and a shortage of ministers. Your generosity makes it possible for our brothers and sisters in Latin America and the Caribbean to share in the life of the Church and grow closer to Christ. - The Liturgy Committee meets this Wednesday in the parish office, beginning at 10:00 am.
- There will be **no daily Mass** on Tuesday or Wednesday.
- **BLESSING OF THROATS**: Saint Blaise was the bishop of Sebastea and a doctor. The first known record of the saint's life comes from the medical writings of Aëtius Amidenus, where he is recorded as helping with patients suffering from objects stuck in their throat. Many of the miraculous aspects of St. Blaise's life are written of 400 years after his martyrdom in the "Acts of St. Blaise."

Saint Blaise is believed to begin as a healer then, eventually, became a "physician of souls." He then retired to a cave, where he remained in prayer. People often turned to Saint Blaise for healing miracles.

In 316, the governor of Cappadocia and of Lesser Armenia, Agricola, arrested then-bishop Blaise for being a Christian. On their way to the jail, a woman set her only son, who was chocking to death on a fish bone, at his feet.

Blaise cured the child, and though Agricola was amazed, he could not get Blaise to renounce his faith. Therefore, Agricola beat Blaise with a stick and tore at his flesh with iron combs before beheading him.

We think of pictures of saints as Holy Cards, yet the torture he endured for his faith was beyond human reason. To remember St Blaise we will have the traditional <u>Blessing of Throats at our masses on Saturday January 30 and Sunday January 31.</u>



Parish Pastoral Council Meeting

12.3.2020

Present at the meeting: Fr. Mark Kusmirek, Pastor, Gary Chance, Mo Watkins and Dennis Kutach; Mike Williams was out of town and not able to join.

Fr. Mark opened with a prayer at 6:35 pm. Father Mark noted that today was the Feast Day of St. Francis Xavier, patron saint of missionaries.

Fr. Mark thanked the Ladies of St. Charles for all their work and especially most recently re: their collecting for Hospice of East Texas. He encouraged us all to continue to spread our Faith in our everyday lives.

September 2020 Minutes were reviewed and approved by Mo and Gary.

Father discussed our recent accomplishments re: security with the addition of cameras strategically placed in the Church with video recording equipment in the working sacristy. He is working with Century Link and Hawk Security for online capability. He will also discuss installation of panic buttons. Father will discuss safety training with the Men's Club. He referenced working with Doug Berry? who works for the Diocese and is qualified to provide this training. The subject of locking the doors during Mass and keeping the Church open during the day was discussed; Father will continue to review this practice with the safety committee.

Parish Outreach: Father discussed his implementation and use of Flock notes in the parish and Catholic Gentleman to improve his communication with everyone in the parish. These online resources are excellent methods to remind us daily how to enrich our Faith through meditation and prayer.

Priest for Tomorrow: Father noted that we have used about \$700 or our funds from this program to purchase the security cameras. More information is in the weekly bulletin.

The group discussed the new banners in Church and how they have made a significant difference on the wall behind the altar. Father purchased these for a reasonable cost and there are banners for the entire year, including Advent, Lent, Easter, and Ordinary Time. They can be changed relatively easy and are very attractive. While on this subject he discussed moving the statue of Mary and the offertory candles to the back for better accessibility and to possibly hang pictures of Mary, Joseph, Sacred Heart, etc. on the wall. in that corner area of the sanctuary.

Sunday 11:00am Mass was noted to be helpful during this pandemic and will continue as needed to accommodate the parish overflow for Mass on Sundays to maintain social distancing.

Gary provided an update on the expansion of the Food Pantry and described the 20X20 room which will accommodate a 6x8 walk in freezer and refrigerators. This expansion has been possible through donations and grants which have been coordinated my Mary Ann and Ken Cluney. Gary noted that the room will be airconditioned as well in the future.

Father discussed his wish to bring people back to Church and our ministry to youth and discussed several ideas. He plans to have further discussions with small groups in 2021 to brainstorm ideas how we can make it easier for people to return and attend Mass and participate in liturgy. Gary suggested adding a flyer when food is handed out during Food Pantry Day.

Gary suggested that we consider adding another member to the council due to the loss of Charlie Hoffman.

Father noted that the 2021 year will be the year of St. Joseph, the patron saint of the Catholic Church.

The next PPC meeting will be Tuesday, March 23, 2021

Our meeting was adjourned with the closing prayer by Father Mark at 7:35pm from St Francis Xavier, today's feast day.
