Parish Pastoral Council Meeting

3/23/2021

Present at the meeting: Fr. Mark Kusmirek, Pastor, Gary Chance, president, Mo Watkins, Mike Williams, and Dennis Kutach

Father Mark opened with a prayer at 6:30 pm. Father Mark prayed that we all evangelize others, especially ourselves. We need to work on ourselves to become better disciples and to instill the Gospel of Christ in others and as well as ourselves.

Fr. Mark noted that attendance at Mass has increased which is very good and the music is going well. He encouraged us all to continue to spread our Faith in our everyday lives.

We will continue to insert the minutes of the PPC in the bulletins for everyone to read.

Last quarter minutes were reviewed with no corrections.

Safety Discussion:

Father led a discussion about security with the addition of cameras strategically placed in the Church with video recording equipment in the working sacristy. Internet has been strengthened. 2 Panic buttons have been installed, one in Church and one in the office. Father will continue to discuss safety training with the Men's Club and others interested. He will coordinate training with Doug Berry who works for the Diocese and is qualified to provide safety training once the pandemic guidelines allow for closer contact with each other. The safety committee will discuss how to better secure the Church especially during liturgical services, such as to have 3 or 4 people during Mass be ready in case there is a situation that warrants their attention. Father emphasized that we need to be ready, cautious, and prudent in our planning.

FLOCKNOTES:

Father noted that there is a 52% response on the Flock notes that he has sent out to reach more parishioners daily. This is a very respectable response. He feels that this action will help us in our daily prayer, reflection, and meditation. Father invited everyone to follow him on Facebook under "Mark Kusmirek".

Statues in Church:

The statue of the Blessed Virgin has been moved from the altar to the back where votive candles can be reached more accessibly, without climbing stairs to the sanctuary.

Father plans to make a couple of other changes such as moving the picture of St. Charles to a larger wall in the back and to ultimately place a statue of the Sacred Heart where the picture of St. Charles was originally. He also suggested a statue of the Holy Family on the altar to which everyone agreed.

Our group discussed the new look in Church created by the banners which reflect the seasons, currently Lent. All agreed that they are very appealing and help us focus on the sanctuary. We have a set for the year, and they will be changed throughout the liturgical seasons.

FOOD PANTRY EXPANSION:

The new freezer was discussed and how successful the installation was, as well as the increased efficiency. The new Freezer and the new trailer (which has Matt: 25 and the name of St. Charles on the side) has enabled the volunteers to accomplish more in this ministry which has been a real blessing. Father thanked all who help and give of themselves with this wonderful ministry of corporal works of mercy in the community.

NEW BUSINESS:

Father led a discussion about a possible grant that may be available from Christus Trinity Mother Francis Hospital Foundation this Fall. More information to follow but one idea is to purchase a van with an accessible lift to help transport people in our church and others in the community to medical visits at the various clinics. There is much more to include in the grant; however, the scope of the grant would be to increase services in the community. Transportation is always a very challenging barrier in the rural communities such as Frankston. The parish will receive more information soon. Father is welcoming and encouraging all of us to suggest ideas that we might have for this grant. Whatever we might suggest should be brought to Father for consideration.

PARISH SIGNAGE:

Father discussed the need to increase awareness through building signage to make St. Charles more visible. Such signage might include the office, Mass and other schedules, the Education Building, Food Pantry and simply, a Welcome Sign. Father would like volunteers to be part of a small work group. Fr. Mark doesn't want another committee, so Gary and Mo volunteered to start looking into what is needed.

COLUMBARIUM COMMITTEE:

Father reported that he has had discussions to expand and build a "Memorial Wall" in the Marian Garden. Plaques for those whom we want to honor and remember, would be purchased and placed on the memorial wall. The wall would initially hold 70-80 plaques but could be expanded as needed. This would not just be for Catholics but whoever we would want to remember, e.g., deceased parish members, family members, friends, others. The construction would be similar to the granite slab like the columbarium and would have brass plaques, 3"X6" at an estimated cost of \$250 each.

OTHER

The committee discussed the carpet near the front of the altar which had been burnt from an "incense malfunction". (3) No action taken at this time

Father discussed a possible need to ZOOM Mass to the Parish Hall at some time in the future depending on the need.

Currently, there are sign up lists in the back of the Church for Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday Masses.

Father noted that he is concerned about possible mold in the office. Insurance has been contacted, a claim submitted and action to be taken this week with an adjuster to evaluate and recommend. An Industrial Hygienist will probably conduct an in-depth investigation and make recommendations. Everyone agreed that this due diligence was necessary and appreciated Father's quick action to correct as needed.

Gary noted that the next PPC meeting will be Tuesday, June 22, 2021

Our meeting was adjourned with the closing prayer by Father Mark at 7:30pm.
