



Parish Pastoral Council Meeting

09/21/2021

Present at the meeting: Fr. Mark Kusmirek, Pastor, Gary Chance, president, Mo Watkins, and Dennis Kutach. Mike Williams was absent.

Father Mark opened with a prayer at 6:45 pm. Father prayed that we continue to do God's work, to be faithful during this pandemic as well as work together to better meet the needs of our Church. Last quarter minutes of 6/22/21 were reviewed with the correction of the spelling of Michael Mahfood's name.

Fr. Mark noted that attendance at Mass has decreased since the resurgence of COVID 19 over the last few months. This may be understandable considering the general make up of our parish of older people who are more at risk. We discussed the stress and concerns that many have and are taking precautions. Bishop Strickland has reminded everyone to continue following CDC guidelines at parishes in East Texas.

We will continue to insert the minutes of the PPC in the bulletins for everyone to read.

Safety Discussion:

Gary and Mo reported that they attended the recent training by Dave Berry last Saturday on being prepared for any serious intrusion at the Church. A discussion ensued of some of the recommendations, including staging a couple of people in the parking lot and inside the church. One clear message is that everyone needs to pay attention to anything unusual or out of the ordinary as we all know the Mass ritual and what is to be expected. We should all stand up and alert others if there is a situation that appears dangerous or of concern. Church greeters may typically be the first to notice if something or someone appears suspicious. Our next step is to have a follow up training.

Mo suggested that we revisit the training for AEDs so that we are all aware and understand what to do if there is an emergency that requires immediate help. Father Mark felt that this suggestion and that the training should be a priority and further suggested that the parish purchase several high quality First Aid Kits that would meet our needs.

FLOCKNOTES:

Father discussed the need to continue using Flock notes that he has sent out to reach more parishioners daily. This is a good source of information re: our spiritual lives. Dennis noted that the Catholic Chanel and EWTC on Sirius Radio was also a very good

source of information re: learning more about our Catholic Faith. In previous meetings Father Mark has invited everyone to follow him on Facebook under "Mark Kusmirek".

PARISH OUTREACH: Father reported that he continues to visit the prisons (he is required and is tested twice a week when he is there) and also has been providing spiritual support to medical staff at Northeast Texas Hospital in Jacksonville. The effects of the pandemic have been hard on staff who work in both the hospital and prisons and is taking a toll on their strength.

Statues in Church:

The statue of the Sacred Heart will be brought from Sacred Heart Parish in Palestine to be placed where the picture of St. Charles was originally. Gary will plan to ask for some help and transport of the statue to Frankston. Father discussed the purchase of 2 or 3 religious oil paintings of the Blessed Mother to be placed in Church that will reflect various liturgical cycles such as Advent and Lent. The parish has received sufficient donations to pay for these paintings from the Diocese. These will add beauty to our Church as well as help enhance the sacred atmosphere our church already has.

Our group also discussed the look in Church created by the banners which reflect the liturgical seasons as well. All felt that they substantially contribute to the spiritual atmosphere. All agreed that they are very appealing and help us focus on the sanctuary. And speaking of the sanctuary...

SANCTUARY AREA CARPET: Plans were discussed to use some existing carpet from the confessional and replace the area which was burned in front of the sanctuary. This could be done at a reasonable cost and improve the appearance.

PARISH SIGNAGE: Gary will move forward with the purchase of several metal signs that will be installed on the outside walls of the Office, Educational Building and Hall. Father noted that Times New Roman font would be used and said that the signs be of a size that could be seen from a reasonable distance. Father noted that these signs are important to identity the different buildings to emergency personnel, visitors, etc.

Columbarium Memorial Wall: Plans will be finalized in the next several weeks. Much of the detail for the wall was discussed during the June meeting.

Church Bell: Father Mark updated us that the bell is ready to be cast and will bear the inscription: St. Charles Borromeo, Frankston TX, established in 1997. The cost of the bell and the engraving of the bell is now covered. The bell will need to be installed on a cedar wood framework that is being discussed by the men's club and Father.

NEW BUSINESS:

Father led a discussion about the grant that the Church is seeking from Christus Trinity Mother Hospital Foundation for \$60K. He and Sue Owens are working together to submit next week. If awarded, the grant would fund grief and bereavement counseling. There is much more to include in the grant; however, the scope of the grant would be to increase services in the community. There has been good feedback from the foundation that our request is in line with what they are seeking; that is, innovative ideas that add value to the community by providing both spiritual and emotional support. This would be a 2-year grant and the funds strictly use for this purpose. More work to come to write up the restrictions and usage guidelines. Gary provided Father with a list of potential grief counselors in the Tyler area. Father hopes that a Catholic counselor could be found if we receive this grant.

Father reported that the liturgy committee has recommended and the bishop has approved for the Saturday Mass time change to 4:00 pm during standard time and revert back to 5pm in the Spring 2022. Several announcements will be made both in the bulletin, email, and after Mass. This change is to ensure safety for all parishioners. Mass on First Friday and holidays will start at 6:30 pm as well.

Utility Building: Father noted that the Sisters of the Soil need additional space to store tools and other essentials used in their work around the Church grounds and in the Marion Garden. He noted that they do a beautiful job and we will support them to make their work easier. Several discussions were made to meet their needs including a possible additional storage building.

Additional PPC member: Father will reach out to several members to ask if they would like to be part of the parish pastoral council.

October: The Rosary will be prayed before Mass on Saturdays and Sundays in October.

Next Meeting: Gary noted that the next PPC meeting will be Tuesday, November 16th, 2021

Our meeting was adjourned with the closing prayer by Father Mark at 8:00 pm.
