







Parish Pastoral Council Meeting

6/22/2021

Present at the meeting: Fr. Mark Kusmirek, Pastor, Gary Chance, Mike Williams, and Martin Cameron (visitor).

Father Mark opened with a prayer at 6:30 pm. Father noted that attendance in the masses is growing. Last Sunday there were 140 parishioners at the 9:00 mass. The committee looking at a replacement for the sign destroyed in the wreck in front of the church is awaiting payment from the insurance company before selecting the new sign bid. One of the possibilities is to take what the insurance company pays us and add to it for an electronic sign board. In the meantime, Ken Cluley is having a vinyl sign that will have the church name and mass times made. It will fit in the pipes used for the Food Pantry sign.

We will continue to insert the minutes of the PPC in the bulletins for everyone to read.

The minutes from the March meeting were reviewed with no corrections.

Safety Discussion:

Father said Doug Barry of the Diocese has a three hour training session that helps congregations to understand what to do in case of a threat at the church. He offers the training on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday mornings. Father said he would contact Doug to set up a Saturday morning session in July and maybe a follow up session in the Fall.

Parish Outreach:

Father noted that there continues to be a good response to the Flock notes being sent out to parishioners.

Sunday Mass Time:

Starting the first Sunday in July, the 11:00 mass will be discontinued and the 9:00 mass will be the only mass offered on Sunday. He has not ruled out a second Sunday mass in the future if our attendance grows. Also, the 8:00 masses have been moved to the Chapel.

Sanctuary Changes:

The statue of the Blessed Virgin has been moved from the altar to the back where votive candles can be reached more accessibly, without climbing stairs to the sanctuary. Mike Williams offered to use his pickup to bring the Sacred Heart statue back to the church from Palestine's Sacred Heart church. It will be placed adjacent to the wall holding the St. Charles Borromeo painting. The painting will be relocated to the left rear wall facing the altar. He has other inspirational decorative changes in the future.

Mo Watkin's in an email before she went out of town said that she thought that we needed handrails going down the steps in front of the altar to assist Father and Eucharistic servers. After some discussion from the group, such handrails are not needed.

There was a discussion about how to hide the burn spot in the carpet in front of the altar steps. Father does not want any hard surface flooring in the church and new carpet would not match the existing carpet color. We rejected the idea of a separate area tapestry to cover the area, due to the hazard of tripping on it. Mike Williams suggested installing a religious symbol in the carpet. The carpet subject was put on hold for now.

Father also mentioned that a group of parishioners is looking at putting a 24" bell in the church grounds to the north of the church where a small tree existed.

Church Building Signs:

During the last March PPC meeting, Father asked Mo Watkins and Gary Chance to look into providing signs for the church buildings with addresses. Gary reported that he had obtained a quote from a sign company in Tyler to make metal signs that would attach to the buildings. Mo also found a source to make these signs out of wood. Father explained that since then, he has settled on signs that would be in the ground near the curb of each building. He will let our group know what he has decided.

Columbarium Memorial Wall:

Gary reported that Jimmy Johnson will hold a committee meeting soon to review a sample plaque that Mike Heine received. The plaque is the size and shape that would be used on the coming concrete wall. Once the plaque design is approved, the concrete wall can be fabricated. In the meantime, the Sisters of the Soil have planted flowers in the base of the wall.

New Business:

Father agreed to consider selecting a parishioner to replace the late Charlie Hoffman's position on the PPC

Father said Michael Moffett was planning to come to our meeting to brief us on the offer from Christus Mother Frances of a substantial grant to be used for a venture of our choosing related to Health or Education. The idea of using for a van has been tabled.

Gary noted that the next PPC meeting will be Tuesday, September 21, 2021

Martin Cameron thanked us for letting him attend our meeting. He said he plans to attend a meeting of the Liturgy committee as well to gain a further understanding of our church activities. Martin is a member of the Finance committee.

Our meeting was adjourned with the closing prayer by Father Mark at 7:30pm.
