



PPC Meeting

November 16, 2021

Present at the meeting: Fr. Mark Kusmirek, Pastor, Gary Chance, chair and Mo Watkins. Dennis Kutach and Mike Williams were absent.

Father Mark opened with a prayer at 6:45 pm.

Fr. Mark's opening remarks reviewed the removal of the dead tree, that many lights had been repaired, and that the sign has been completed. All are beneficial for the community. Mass attendance has picked up and the 4 pm Mass was well attended. Fr. Mark is still uncertain about how to handle the continuing COVID dilemma. On a positive note, the choir will begin singing again on Sunday, Nov. 21. There was a nice turnout for the life chain and 40 days for life. We still need to continue outreach to our community and get in contact with people we haven't seen in a while.

Last quarter minutes of 9/21/21 were reviewed and approved. It was suggested to post the minutes on the website, making new tabs for parish council, liturgy, finance council, etc.

Old Business: We received the grant from Mother Frances, but still need to send an acknowledgment to receive the money. A discussion ensued on where we want to provide services. The counselor we had hoped to employ is not available at this time. We do need to cross our t's and dot our i's when implementing the new program. We still have 3 months to prepare before we begin. A special bank account will set up for this program.

Our electronic sign is up and bright, especially at night and in Fr.'s bedroom window. Fr. Mark said we will be receiving more training to make the sign "zippy", but not flashy.

Our parish outreach has been bustling: nursing, bereavement, UT Student Center, food pantry and other LOSC activities.

The church building signs have been designed for the Office, Parish Hall, Education Building and Food Pantry. Fr. Mark will take care of getting the work completed.

Nothing has been decided on a new PPC member.

There is no news on the Columbarium Wall as they are still looking for the right price to complete it.

New Business: Mo indicated someone made a suggestion to have a library for our church community. This was met with interest. Placement in the church hall would make it accessible to more people. The Men's Club may be persuaded to create some shelving.

Our St. Charles bell goes to the foundry this week. It will have old style writing with patina. The Men's Club will build the needed structure. It was suggested to secure the bell to the crossbar with a chain. It is a nice blend of contemporary and old world.

Closing prayer was given by Fr. Mark.
